## I. Introduction

The purpose of this Memorandum is to address all applicable policies related to OPWDD Care Management that were impacted during the federal Public Health Emergency (PHE) and to rescind those flexibilities as applicable. With the federal notification that Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is planning to end the PHE on May 11, 2023, the flexibilities available during the pandemic will end and agencies should return to operational requirements as described in OPWDD Administrative Memoranda (ADMs), rules, regulations, and other guidance.

Absent further notification from HHS that the PHE will end on a date other than May 11, 2023, the effective dates provided in this guidance document will remain applicable, and provider agencies should commence planning unwinding activities accordingly.

## II. End of the Federal PHE

The end date of the federal PHE is **May 11, 2023**. Some of the flexibilities applicable to CCO/HHs end when the PHE ends on May 11, 2023, and some flexibilities end no later than six months after the end of the PHE (November 11, 2023). Since March 2020, flexibilities providing relief on requirements were afforded through various mechanisms including federal waivers under Section

1135 of the Social Security Act, and Appendix K to the OPWDD 1915(c) Comprehensive Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waiver.

## III. Expectations for Care Planning Post PHE

The Memo titled *Care Planning and Service Options Post Pandemic* issued August 2, 2021, remains in effect outlining the expectations for care planning post PHE. ## IV. Revised Policies/End date of PHE Flexibility

The Interim Care Planning Memorandum, last revised September 18, 2020, should now be considered rescinded. The chart below establishes the end dates of each PHE flexibility related to Care Management and references where to find the applicable policy in effect when the flexibility ends.
